

APPARENT CHRONOLOGY:

- 1769 8 Dec. Walpole 5th mate on Harcourt, an East Indiaman. [Folder 4:1]
8-9 Dec. W borrows £150 from Earl Winterton due 8 Dec 1770 [4:1] makes will and power of attorney in Winterton's favor [1:1; 2:1], buys stones [12:2] in London.
1770. 8 Jan. W buys a boat-cloak [14:1] in London.
1771. Sept-Dec. W buying clothes for himself from London tailors [14:1; 14:2]
26 Nov. Edward Inge [apparently Winterton's man-of-affairs] recompensed by Winterton for becoming bound for W [23:1].
- 30 Nov. W 4th mate of the ship Granby, an East Indiaman, [3:1] Capt. Johnson. W and Inge enter into Bond of Respondentia with French and Hobson (London merchants) for merchandise aboard the Granby: principal £500, interest £110 [3:1]
- 6 Dec. W buys £52 of lamps and glasses from Benj. Weatherby, London [for resale]. [17:1]
- 9 Dec. W buys £32 of hosiery from John Williamson jr, London [for resale] [17:1]
- 9 Dec. W borrows £500 from Earl Winterton due 10 Mar 1773 [4:2]
[Dec?] W buys for resale: £88 of cutlery from Hardy, £140 of hats from Isaac Dent, 432 of iron hoops from John Wood [11:1].
- 21 Dec W sailing from the Downs aboard the Granby about now [20:2]
1772. W sells some merchandise at Batavia, buys dishes, tea, etc from Chinese and European merchants at Canton [11:1; 13:1]
W has personal and cabin expenses Gravesend; Downs; The Cape; Batavia; Canton; Whampoa; The Cape; St. Helena. [12:1]
1773. June-Nov. W buying clothes for himself in London [15:1; 15:2]
25 June W pays off Nov 1771 bond [3:1]
25 June W borrows £600 from Winterton due 25 Dec 1773. [4:3]; W still termed 4th mate of the Granby.
? Friendly letter from C. Griffenhoofe, late messmate of W's [20:1]
1773. 2 Nov. W 3rd mate of the ship Asia, an East Indiaman, Capt. William Dick Gamage [4:4; 5:1]
2 Nov. W borrows £243 from Winterton due 2 Nov 1711: [4:4]
4 Nov W borrows £300 from Alexander Smith, saddler (respondentia) [5:1]

- 19-20 Nov. W makes will and power of attorney in Winterton's favor [1:2; 2:2]
 18 Nov-11Dec. W buying personal and mess items, and Asia's stores [16],
 London.
1773. 24 Nov-17 Dec. W buying for resale: £31 of glass from Weatherby, £115 of hats
 from Dent, 9113 of stockings from Treadway, £150 of
 saddlery from Alexander Smith, jewelry from James
 Langton [18]
 30 Nov. W borrows £63 from Treadway, due 30 May 177L. cP:li
 7 Dec. W borrows £100 from Dent (respondentia) c9:lj
 17 Dec. W borrows £158 from Alexander Smith (respondentia) [10:1]
1774. 10 Mar. W at Lisbon [19:1-3; 13:1]
1774. Sep. Walpole drowned in Bengal River. [22:6]

- 1774 . Sept Dec. Capt. Gamage settling up shipboard and Calcutta minor debts,
 having WW's goods sold by the Company in Calcutta.
 [13:1; 22:1-6]
1775. 3 July. Winterton & Inge meet with Capt. Gamage in London. [21:1]
 5 July. Walpole's will proved. [1:2; 21:1]
 6 Sept. Inge discovers Mr. Farquaharson's power of attorney. [21:1]
- 16 Dec. Capt. Gamage notifies Winterton that rupees are awaiting him in
 London [20:4;22: 7-8]
1776. 15 Jan. Treadway assigns his bond to Robert Thornber, Vintner, for £63.
 [8:1]
 13 Feb. Creditors meet with Inge at the Devil Tavern [21:1]
 6 Apr. Langton, Dent, Thornber compose with Winterton; Inge submits
 his bill [21:1; 22:9; 9:1; 11:2]
 23 May. 2 parcels for which Walpole had been responsible forwarded by
 Winterton to Midshipman George Edwards on board the Roebuck
 in America. [22:10]
 15 June. Alexander Smith composes with Winterton [10:1]
- 1777 26 Apr. Jacob Smith (assignee of 5:1) composes with Winterton [5:1]
