The Bartrams (father and son) were one of Dr. Harper's primary interests. He collected extensive material on John and William, publishing John's *Diary of a Journey through the Carolinas, Georgia, and Florida, 1765-66*, and William's *Travels in Georgia and Florida* (Annotated by Francis Harper and published as *Transactions of the American Philosophical Society* Philadelphia, 1942) Dr. Harper also published *The Travels of William Bartram, Naturalist's Edition* (New Haven: Yale University Press, 1958).

Series IIA: Boxes 4, 5.a and 5.b: *William Bartram, Naturalist* (WBN), Dr. Harper prepared most of the material for a definitive biography of William Bartram, much of which was in the final stages of preparation when Dr. Harper died in 1972. These papers were brought together and arranged by Dr. Harper's son, David B., before they were transferred to the University of Kansas. Variouslly called "William Bartram's Life as a Naturalist," "Life and letters of William Bartram" and "William Bartram, Naturalist" or "WBN," Harper included individually labeled sections and chapters, such as "Early Years" (WBN: EY); First Carolina Adventure (WNB: FCA), Relations with Contemporary Naturalists (WBN: RCN), etc. This material is filed and listed *alphabetically* by a keyword in the title, rather than in the order of the appearance in the proposed biography.

Series V. Maps, Aerial Photographs and Travel Aids

The maps mainly cover North America with geographical concentrations in the US Southeast and Northeast and Northern Canada—areas where Francis Harper lived and did field research. Other geographical areas represented are the world, Central America and Europe. In regard to subject matter, there are general, topographic, thematic and travel maps, as well as aerial photographs and travel aids. Many of the topographic maps are field-worn with ms annotations. There are photographic copies of some early maps that served as historical sources for his research on the travels of John and William Bartram. There are also some of Harper's manuscript sketch maps, as well as original artwork and proofs for maps to illustrate his publications. For instance, a set of aerial photographs covering the area from Simons' Lake to Windy Bay is present, as are the artwork and proofs of the map of that area published in his book, *The Mammals of Keewatin*.
