

MAIN ENTRY: Neave, David, fl. 1646-1647.

Commentaries on Aristotle's Organon, and on Porphyrius' Eisagoge to Aristotle. Dictated to his student, Alexander Bruce (probably 2nd Earl of Kincardine, 1629?-1680).

DATES WRITTEN: 28 Jan 1646-5 Mar 1647

PLACE: cGt. Brit.: Scotland: Perthshire: Culross ?

LANGUAGE: Latin

TYPE: Book: philosophy

(with some Greek words)

WARNING: Extremely FRAGILE; disbound; paper crumbling; bifolia divided. DO NOT ISSUE unless absolutely necessary; Handle with extreme care; keep in pam box except when being read. INCOMPLETE; pp. 410-762 not in original order. DOES NOT CIRCULATE. Use microfilm (M83) instead.

CONTENTS: Regulae quaedam de ratione disputandi; Praeludia in universam Aristotilis logicum; Comentarii in Isagogem Porphyrii; and commentaries or annotamenta on Aristotle's Categoriae, De interpretatione, Priora analytica, Posteriora analytica cincomplete, Topica, Sophistici elenchi.

See following sheets for a more detailed Contents following present page numbering: Follows the Latin capita of the original text; usually breaks the Caput down into Disputationes, then into Sectiones, and finally into Objectiones and Responsiones. With diagrams; occasional Latin couplets.

PAGINATION: ci-iv; 1-409 (numbered in ink, probably in original hand), c410, 411-762 (numbered on rectos in modern pencil; does not show original order correctly). Sequence has not been checked page by page, but has no gross omissions.

COLLATION:

SCRIPT: Hasty cursive semi-secretary; not very legible. Some photostats in MS records.

ORNAMENT: Crudely floriated red initials on pp i, 1, 35, 125, 269, 511, 563. (Underlined numbers indicate more interesting initials)

MATERIAL: Paper (tender, crumbling, browning, formerly moldy)

WATERMARK:

BINDING: Only the two detached boards remain (kept in pam box with MS). DISBOUND. Brown calf over cardboard; 3-line marginal blind ruling; formerly 2 clasps.

NOTES: James Ritchie, Deputy Keeper, Dept of MSS, National Library of Scotland, identified Bruce as 2nd Earl to Rosenthal (see MS records) but could not identify Neave. He added that The Nat. Library had a similar volume of 1645 notes on theology and math, given to them in 1954 by W.L. Ferguson of Edinburgh. There are a number of other possible Alexander Bruce's, even in the Kincardine line; but the 2nd Earl's character is consonant with this material: see Scottish Peerage and DNB. The Neave or Neaves family is an old Forfarshire stock.

PLACE is a guess. The 2nd Earl might well have been at Culross at this time.

TEXT has not been checked for completeness. Obviously the Posterior analytics are confused and incomplete; but there may be other confusions or omissions.
