With 144 photos by the diarist, and with her illustrations. Also a few pressed flowers, a piece of elephant hide, maps, stamps, clippings, and souvenirs. **COPY STATUS**: Contemporary typed copy of her diary, bound. (1 vol).

The diary is made up out of extensive selections from letters to her friends and family, typed up after her return, and bound along with the photos, sketches and watercolors she had made. The diary also transcribes some parallel accounts by other members of the party. (Since some events are described several times, the diary is confusing to read in the present order.)

Souvenirs and some original correspondence are also bound in.

All items are pasted on blank leaves, except the full-size watercolors (which are stubbed directly into the binding), and the hand-drawn title-page.

## DIGEST OF ITINERARY:

W's trip probably had begun in London, and passed through Cadiz. The diary begins sporadically on Nov 19 1904 in the Red Sea approaching Aden; arrives Bombay Nov 25. On Dec 8 (Pedder Road, Bombay) she is invited by **Lady Jenkins** to go to Somaliland with a shooting party containing "the Resident and another local magnate" with an "escort of 100 men". W will be sketching, not shooting.

Dec 14 1904. Arrives in Aden, and **W**, **J**, and **M** board the Dalhousie under the guidance of **L**. Dec 15 change to the small dirty Falcon to cross the Red Sea to Bulhar. Party enlarged by **B** and **H**. Slept and loaded the caravan (Somalis, camels, ponies, donkeys, cows, goats). Dec 16 evening began trek (often travelling at night), L & H deal with the caravan and set up camps. Dec 18 Bigi camp: begin nightly manning of Zareebas (hides). Dec 20 trek to Karin Faras camp. Dec 22 Bag 5 elephants; wounded elephant charged W in camp. Dec 25. Simodi. Entertain Somalis. Dec 26. Kopri Bahur camp (**L & B** left the party, arriving Bulhar Dec 28; sailed on Falcon to Berbera; Dec 30 left for Aden and home.)

Jan 1 1905. Trek to Galeedub. Jan 2 W & H trek to Gaad (lost on way). Jan 4 trek toward Bulhar. Jan 5. Arrive at "Mr. Thompson"'s bungalow at Berbera, surf-boat to Falcon, then Bulhar. Jan 6. Falcon to Aden.

Jan 6 1905. W at Aden (sleeping aboard the P & O Caledonia, touring the area, and having parties). 10 Jan left for home aboard the Caledonia.

Conventions used

[AW] = Unsigned typed copy of journal-entry written by Antonia Williams as a letter.

"On leaf no. 2" = The item is pasted on the front of the album-leaf which was marked "2" in the top left corner in pencil. "On leaf no. 2v" = Item is pasted on back of leaf 2.

"Item 2" or "Item 14b" = Number to use to cite a specific item, e.g., MS E72:14b. (The item number does not appear on the item or the leaf.)

"Quoted" = text marked with quotation-marks in ink. Apparently not written by AW. Often accounts of a *shikar* (journal of the day's hunt and bag, kept by a member of the shooting party, probably Mr. Higgins).

[ ] = text inserted by cataloguer.
