#### Scope and Content

The Raymond J. Eastwood Papers are arranged chronologically in 34 folders at PP/4, Box 1. They include not only Eastwood's career papers from 1942 until his death in 1987, but also papers generated from 1987 to 1996 regarding the disposition of his estate paintings.

The Eastwood papers for the period 1942-44 consist primarily of career documents (personnel forms and letters of reference) from Eastwood's military service and his early years on the faculty of the University of Kansas. Papers for the period 1944 to 1987 consist of Eastwood's correspondence regarding exhibition and sale of his paintings, consignment agreements with art galleries; public announcements and catalogs for exhibitions of his work; and bills of sale, price lists, and gallery inventories for paintings. Papers for the years following Eastwood's death in 1987 are comprised of correspondence, inventories, and exhibitions prepared or acquired by studio owner Judi Kellas for settlement and disposition of Eastwood estate paintings.

Photographs in the Raymond J. Eastwood Papers are housed in Boxes 2 and 3 at PP/4 in the University Archives.

In addition to the Raymond J. Eastwood Papers, the Archives' morgue files for Eastwood contain references to published sources of Eastwood information, as well as many news clippings, Eastwood resumes, exhibition announcements and catalogs, typescripts of biographical information regarding Eastwood, and his obituary. The Archives' morgue files for Eastwood contain information for the period 1926-1995.
